NOTICE OF RACE

1. Rules

2. Eligibility

- a. The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and the Rules of the Ultimate 20 Class Association. This regatta is a Category A event.

3. Fees

- a. Entry Fee\$160.00
b. Late Fee (after June 12th)\$20.00
c. Non US Sailing Member\$5.00

4. Schedule of Events

- a. Thursday, June 22, 2006
i. Check-In, Registration and Measurement – 9:00am to 5:00pm. Located in the Best Western Hotel Conference room, first floor. Access at the back of the hotel.
ii. Class Association Annual Meeting – 11:00 am. Conference room, 1st floor of the Best Western. Boat inspections to follow. Contact the race organizers, (Bob Aman, Chris Chambers) if you will not arrive until Friday, June 23rd to make special arrangements.
iii. Practice Racing - TBD. If time and weather allows.
- b. Friday, June 23, 2006
i. Skippers Meeting – 10:30am at the CGRA sailing shack. The Warning for the first race – 12:00 pm, other races to follow
ii. Annual Banquet, with no host cocktails at 6:00pm and dinner at 7:00pm. At the Sam Hill's River Room located downstairs of the Charburger Restaurant.
- c. Saturday, June 24, 2006
i. The Warning for the first race – 10:30am; remaining races to follow.
- d. Sunday, June 25, 2006
i. The Warning for the first race – 10:30; remaining races to follow. No race will start on Sunday after 3:00pm
ii. Awards – 5:00pm. Conference room, 1st floor of the Best Western hotel. If the weather is good, perhaps on the Charburger Restaurant patio.

5. Measurement

- a. All sails must be measured unless built by the Class sail maker prior to 2003. This measurement process will take place as stated above.

6. Sailing instructions

- a. Sailing Instructions will be available at Check-in

7. Racing Area

- a. The racing area will be directly off the Port of Cascade Locks Marine Park Marina and East up river.

8. Course

- a. The courses will be windward-leeward of a length to be determined by the Principal Race Officer. The desired course length shall be 1-2 miles as conditions allow.

9. Scoring

- a. Except as otherwise noted, the Low Point scoring system of Appendix A of the RRS will apply, modified so that each boat's series score will be the total of her race scores with her worst score discarded if at least 7 races have been completed and her 2 worst scores discarded if at least 10 races have been competed, except when prohibited by rule 88.3. As many races will be sailed as conditions allow and boat owners desire. One Race will constitute a series.

10. Awards

- a. The North American Championship Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the winning boat. Other trophies will be awarded per the following schedule based on registrations as of June 12th, 2006:
i. 10 boats or less 1st through 3rd Place
ii. 11-15 boats 1st through 4th Place
iii. 16 or more boats 1st through 5th Place
- b. All trophies will be awarded Sunday, June 25th, at 5:00, pending protests.
